



Notice of Public Hearing

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) will hold a one-day public hearing to consider Cameco Corporation's (Cameco) application to amend the Cigar Lake Project Uranium Mine Construction Licence (UMCL) to complete remediation and construction of the Cigar Lake Project. The Cigar Lake Project is located within the Athabasca Basin in northern Saskatchewan.

Hearing: November 6, 2009
Place: Saskatoon Travelodge Hotel, 106 Circle Drive West, Saskatoon, SK
Time: as set by the agenda published prior to the hearing date

The public hearing will be webcasted live on the Internet via the CNSC Web site and archived for a period of 90 days.

Cameco seeks authorization to complete the mine remediation and to finalize the construction activities required for the five phases of the project. Cameco also seeks authorization to complete activities related to Shaft number 2 and to continue surface construction. Cameco request a four-year licence term to allow enough time for the completion of all the planned activities.

The public is invited to comment on Cameco's application. Requests to intervene must be filed with the Secretary of the Commission by October 7, 2009 on-line at (<http://www.nuclearsafety.gc.ca/eng/commission/intervention/index.cfm>) or at the address below. The request must include the following information, as per the *Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission Rules of Procedure*:

- a written submission of the comments to be presented to the Commission;
- a statement setting out whether the requester wishes to intervene by way of written submission only or by way of written submission and oral presentation; and
- name, address and telephone of the requester.

It should be noted that all submissions are available to the public upon request to the Secretariat.

Cameco's submission and CNSC staff's recommendations to be considered at the hearing will be available on September 8, 2009. These documents are not available on-line and must be requested through the Secretariat at the address below.
