CNSC Participant Funding Decision:

Meeting with Mississauga First Nation about Cameco's Blind River Refinery and the CNSC's Independent Environmental Monitoring Program

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) has offered up to \$2,700 under its Participant Funding Program (PFP) to facilitate a meeting between Mississauga First Nation and CNSC staff. Mississauga First Nation, which is directly adjacent to the Blind River Refinery, had requested the meeting to discuss the facility's performance during 2014, as well as the CNSC's regulatory role and details of the CNSC's Independent Environmental Monitoring Program (IEMP).

This funding offer was made as part of the PFP's support for CNSC meetings on matters of regulatory interest. The information gathered from the meeting will be included in a relevant Commission member document, so as to bring any valuable information gathered to the Commission's attention. The deadline for submitting the participant funding application to the CNSC was September 7, 2015.

Background

The CNSC made participant funding available to:

- enhance Aboriginal and stakeholder participation in the CNSC's regulatory oversight and licensing processes
- help stakeholders bring valuable information to the Commission

A Funding Review Committee (FRC) independent from the CNSC was established to review the funding application received by the CNSC and to make recommendations on the allocation of up to \$2,700 to the applicant.

The FRC member was Mr. Guy Riverin, environmental assessment expert and retired federal public servant.

CNSC participant funding decision
